<u>DRESSING</u>	<u>SHOWERING</u>
◆ Dressing can become blood stained; this is not unusual.	♦ It is OK to shower after 24 hours.
♦ OK to change dressing if needed.	◆ Please keep wounds dry.
◆ If you feel the bleeding is excessive, call the Doctor.	◆ Wrap with plastic wrap.
♦ You may remove dressing in 24 hours.	◆ Redress wound after shower.
♦ Cover with gauze or ace wrap.	
◆ Sutures/staples will be removed in the office.	
<u>ACTIVITY</u>	CALL THE DOCTOR IF YOU
♦ Elevate operative leg above level of heart.	<u>EXPERIENCE</u>
♦ Ice to operative knee 20 minutes/hour as tolerated.	◆ Persistent or abnormal bleeding.
♦ Bend and straighten leg 5-10 times per hour as tolerated.	♦ Fever or chills.
♦ Rest, Ice, Elevation, Compression.	◆ Temperature greater than 101.
	◆ Severe and uncontrolled pain or swelling.
<u>WEIGHTBEARING</u>	♦ Abnormal wound drainage.
♦ You may bear % body weight on operative leg.	Medication problems.
♦ Use crutches as needed.	
♦ If provided with knee brace, use for walking and sleeping.	
♦ OK to remove brace while sitting.	
<u>MEDICATIONS</u>	FOLLOW-UP APPOINTMENT
◆ Percocet/Vicodin/Darvocet can make you nauseous.	♦ 24-48 hours
◆ Take medications with food.	♦ 7-10 days
♦ Do NOT drive while taking pain meds.	◆ Call <u>949-727-3636</u> to schedule
◆ Call if pain is not well controlled.
